

FIRST Scholarship Application



Description and Criteria

Pace University has established up to two scholarships per year, renewable annually for up to 4 years for students who meet the stated eligibility requirements below.

To be eligible for the Seidenberg *FIRST* Scholarship, students must:

- Have participated on a team in a *FIRST* sponsored program (either *FIRST* Robotics Competition or *FIRST* Tech Challenge) any time during high school.
- Be accepted into and enroll in Pace University as a full time student.
- Pursue a major offered through the Seidenberg School of Computer Science and Information Systems (CSIS). Current majors include computer science, information systems, and information technology.
- Have earned at least an 87% high school average and a combined SAT score of 1100 (minimum 500 Evidence Based Reading/Writing – ERW and 600 Math) OR minimum composite ACT score of 24.

To remain eligible for the scholarship, students must maintain an overall Pace QPA of 3.0 and major in a discipline offered through the Seidenberg School of CSIS.

Application Deadline and Checklist

Once an applicant has applied to attend Pace University, the *FIRST* Scholarship application materials listed below must be submitted to the given address no later than **April 15**. (See page 2 for application form and details)

1. Completed Seidenberg *FIRST* Scholarship application form.
2. Official high school transcript.
3. 200-300 word essay (printed or typed).
4. Two letters of recommendation:
 - a. One recommendation from a high school counselor or teacher.
 - b. One recommendation from their *FIRST* adult mentor or coach.
