

Login

Headings (1)

- Start and end a line with equal signs
- One equal sign (=) for the first level heading, two (==) for the second level subheading, etc
- Up to 5 equal signs maximum
- Note: Do not put spaces before and after the equal signs



- Italics

Inserting URLs and Images

- An hyperlink is created when an URL is put between brackets []
- Example: [http://www.pace.edu Pace University] creates:

 [Pace University](http://www.pace.edu)

- If an URL ends with an image extension, the image is displayed
- Example:
[http://www3.ca.com/images/CompanyLogo/pace_university_logo.gif] displays

Creating a New Page

- Simply join capitalized words together and the wiki will create an empty placeholder page on the wiki and hyperlinks it automatically
- Example: BrandNewPage creates:

[BrandNewPage](#)

- When the BrandNewPage link is clicked on, it will re-direct to an empty placeholder page, which then can be edited

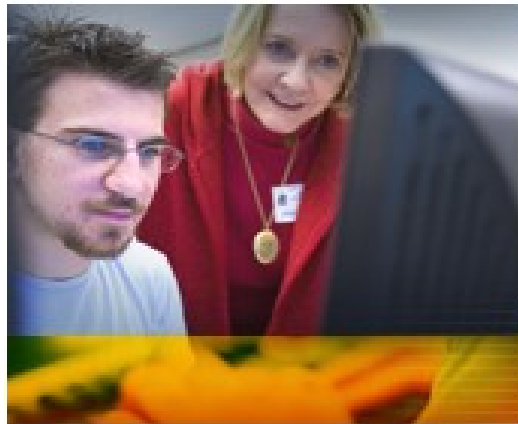
Attaching Files (1)

- You can use the attachment directive directly in your wiki code
- Example: `[attachment:file.doc My File]` creates a link which when clicked will permit you to upload a file

Attached Files

To refer to attachments on a page, use `attachment:filename`, as shown below in the list of files. Do **NOT** use the URL of the `[get]` link, since this is subject to change and can break easily.

- [\[get\]](#) [\[view\]](#) (0.0 KB) attachment:`wikifun.txt`

New Attachment

An upload will never overwrite an existing file. If there is a name conflict, you have to rename the file that you want to upload. Otherwise, if "Rename to" is left blank, the original filename will be used.
